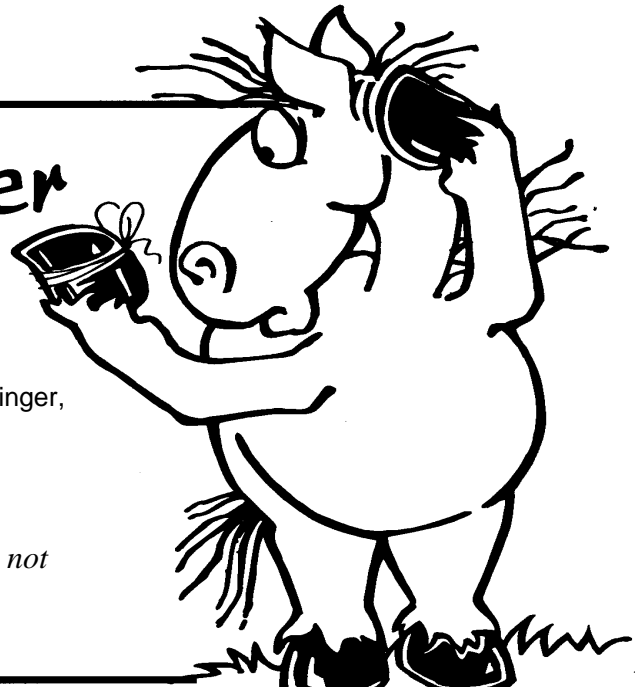

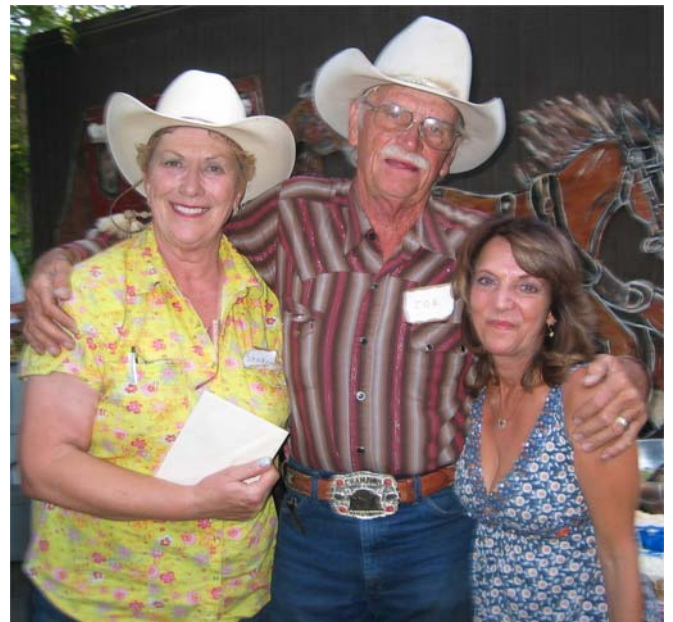

### **DIRECTIONS:**

From the Santa Clarita Valley, follow Route 14 towards Palmdale and exit at Agua Dulce Canyon Road. Turn left and follow Agua Dulce Canyon Road north under the freeway through Agua Dulce to Sierra Highway. Turn right (east) on Sierra Highway and a short distance past the Peppertree Market (on your left across Sierra Hwy from winery) turn left onto Wyse Road. Follow Wyse Road until it becomes dirt then turn right onto Hierba. 8907 will be about a mile east on Hierba on your left.

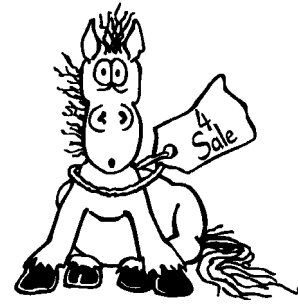
From Palmdale, exit Route 14 at the first exit past (west) Crown Valley Road. When you stop, turn left onto Sierra Highway. Follow Sierra Highway (bear right at first intersection or you'll be back on the freeway) over Boiling Point, past Fire Station 81 (on your left) to Wyse Road and turn right. The right turn for Wyse Road will be where the passing lane on Sierra Hwy ends. Proceed to 8907 as above.

## Hideaway Ride (October 24th)

We will meet at Ranger Park and ride out at 5:00 PM. The ride will go around the ponds/water trail (because of forest closure) for a couple of hours and then we'll ride to the Hideaway for a pizza dinner. Those who don't want to go to the Hideaway for dinner can get dropped off at their rigs on our way up there.

Ranger Park staging area is on the northeast corner of Foothill Blvd. and Clybourn Ave. in Lake View Terrace (91342). This is a nice big dirt lot (1st and 2nd driveway on the right when you turn onto Clybourn) with plenty of parking for large rigs.

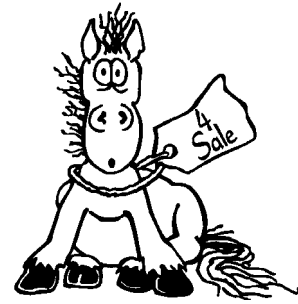

## HISTORIAN'S CORNER

This article will be the first and longest in a series that will help the newer members learn about some history of ETI Corral 22. Most of this information has come from the Corral 22 archives (a couple of boxes of writings, photographs, old newspaper and ETI magazine articles). The non-rider historians have not been in Corral 22 all that long .... Soooo, some of you that have been long time members PLEASE help us fill in the gaps and correct any misinformation. This issue will deal with mostly dates, who was president and whatever else fits. In future issues we will try to give a more detailed account of things that were done and who was involved. At the conclusion of this series it will be available to all on the Corral 22 website.

As you know from the previous newsletter, it all began April 23, 1951 when ETI National chartered Corral 22. The founding president was Alice G. Bonneville (more about her next issue) and was centered around the Northridge area. The best info at hand regarding Corral presidents is:

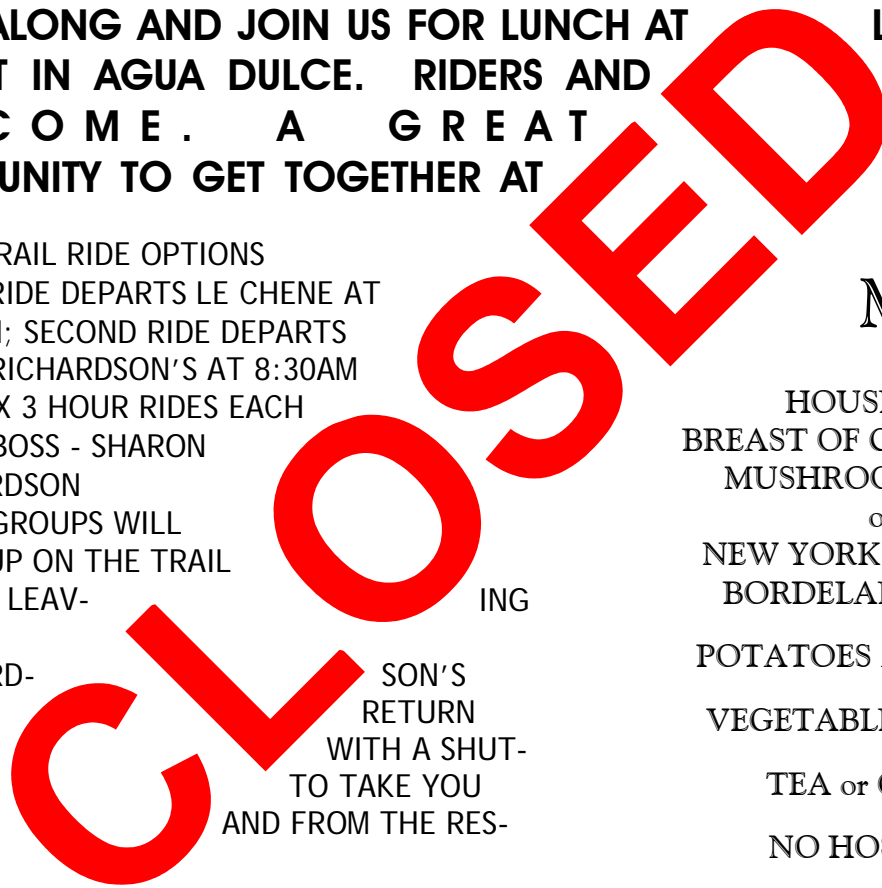
