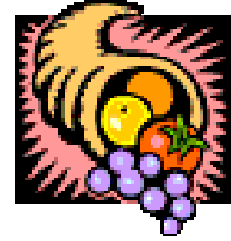

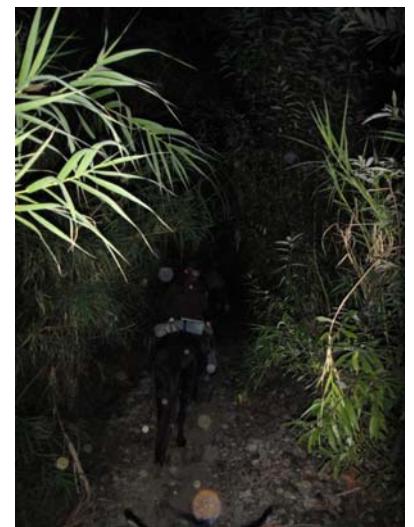

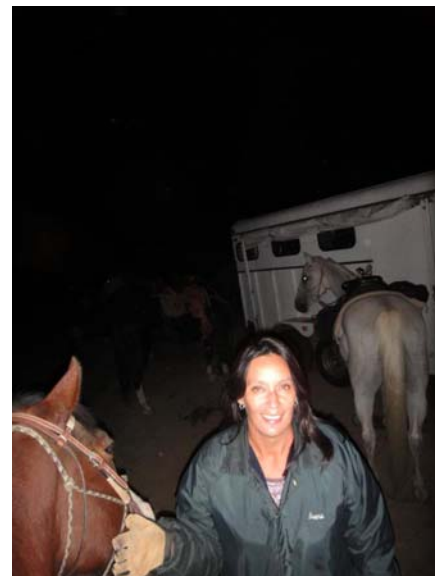

P.S. Remember C22 is known to be very punctual on their rides! WE LEAVE ON TIME! So please get to the staging area an hour before! This way you have time to sign in, relax, saddle, breath and be in the saddle at 10 minutes before your departure time! I know other Corrals do not worry about being punctual, however C22 does and always has. Keep the cell number of your trail boss with you on your journey to your destination. If you have problems, then call and let him or her know. They can leave a rider who can get you caught up with the ride. You may have to trot until you get caught up. It is important to keep the ride together at a comfortable pace. If the ride is too spaced out then you have horses jiggling and upset. If you go too slow then you have the horses bunched up which again is uncomfortable for the horse and rider. Also, a rider or horse can get kicked. If you can keep your horse from stopping to poop, then that doesn't throw off the whole group. Of course if your horse has to pee, tell the trail boss and we'll all stop. We should always have walkie talkies, this way we can communicate with the trail boss or drag rider. We should always provide a potty stop every hour for the equestrians. This way we can keep the ride moving and no dawdling. "Gosh what a concept!"

## Historian's Corner

### Historian's Corner Part #16

In Corral 22 it had become a custom to have certain annual rides. Tehachapi, Cuyamaca, Heart Bar and Yosemite for long distance weekend or weekly destinations & Point Mugu, Marshall Canyon, the Steak Dinner Ride at the Castaic Equestrian Center, the newly popular Mulligan Stew Ride and Art Monde's Christmas Poker Ride in Griffith Park. The monthly general meeting times and location now varied from month to month (although they were usually still on Thursdays). The Corral newsletter would announce meeting time & place. When the meetings were held at a member's home there was usually lots of food. The annual trail ride planning meeting for the next year was always held in October. There was a lot involved to get the rides scheduled for the following year and it took a lot of cooperation from the general membership to secure 23-25 rides and make them fun & interesting.

Although the officers for Corral 22 remained the same since the July 1979 installation party, Cal Plum of Chatsworth replaced Joe Marinello as Area 7 Director.

The year 1979 ended with a bang, Art's Christmas Poker Ride in Griffith Park had 131 riders! The ride started at the Cricket Field behind the Bar S Stables in Burbank. The riders rode through the hills in Griffith Park stopping for a chicken lunch on the Hollywood side of the Park then back to Burbank. The Corral charged \$2.50 for lunch + \$5.00 for a poker hand. First prize was \$100.00 and down to \$25 for 5<sup>th</sup> place. This was the biggest turnout for any Corral 22 event and was a financial success adding \$350 to the treasury. Previous Christmas rides had great turnouts but not like this one.

There were some major changes in ETI National that affected everyone. As of January 1<sup>st</sup> of 1980, ETI membership dues changed to a calendar year. If you paid your dues in July you would only pay for ½ year to get caught up to the new system. Also the officers terms for all of ETI extended until December 31<sup>st</sup> of that year. Elections of ETI National as well as Corral officers would take place in November. It was also decided at this time to change Corral 22's name. It didn't seem appropriate to keep the name "Northridge". Membership in the Corral extended from Agua Dulce to Pacific Palisades & from Alhambra to Sylmar & throughout the San Fernando Valley. Since the Corral was a trail riding group the new name should reflect that.




## Historian's Corner (continued)

Members had a chance to contribute their name ideas in a contest. There were many unique names submitted such as "Happy Trails 22, Ridge Riders, The Happy Wanderers, Good Time Riders, Saddle Tramps & Hoofbeats of 22". There were so many suggestions from the membership that they could not decide on a new name so "Northridge" was dropped and the Corral was just known as Corral 22.

In 1980, The California Farm Bureau, California State Horseman's Association, ETI and the University of California conducted a equine census for the entire state to determine the number of horses, donkeys & mules in the state. This census would be vital to the present & future needs of horseman through the state. It was hoped that an accurate account of equines would also impress the legislators as to the importance of the horse industry in California.

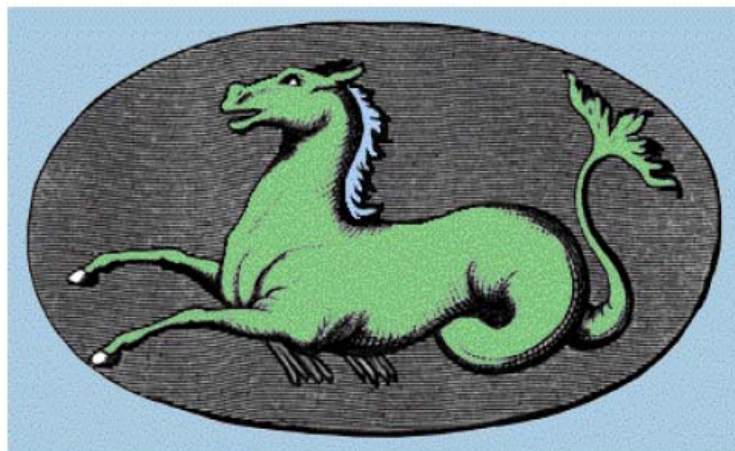

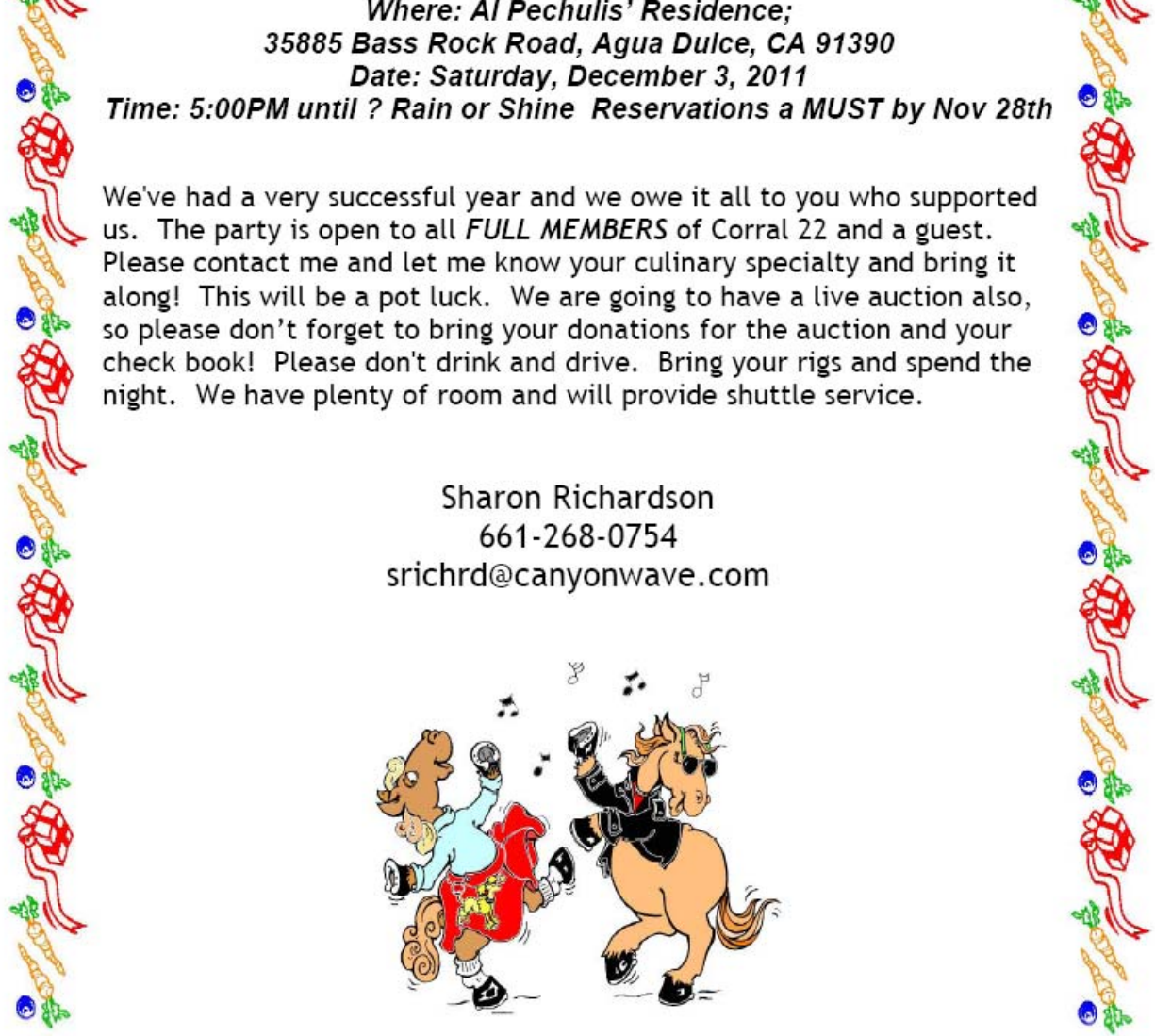
