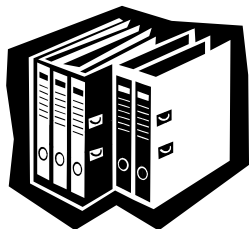

Historian's Corner

Historian's Corner Part # 15

Gwen Allen, the elected President of Corral 22 for the remaining 1979 year, had moved from Saskatchewan Canada in 1948 at the age of 14 with her family and settled in Burbank, living in a travel trailer until her father built the family home in Pacoima. She attended John Burroughs Junior High in Burbank and graduated from San Fernando High.

Gwen and her sister had had horses in their native Canada but it wasn't until she took her 3 sons to Mexico on vacation that she got back into horses. Her oldest son Michael, had been riding at a local stables and wanted to stay to help the owner clean, feed and groom the horses. Mom Gwen "could come back and get him when school started"..... Well that just was not going to happen! When they got back home Gwen got Michael a horse for his 10th birthday.

Gwen attended her first ETI corral meeting in early 1964. Corral 12 was having their general meeting at the VFW Hall on Polk St. in Sylmar and she "just" wanted to check things out. When she left the meeting that night she was the Secretary of Corral 12. Gwen remained Secretary for a couple of years, then in 1966 was elected President of Corral 12 and held that position until the late '60's. She started riding with Corral 22 in early 1972 and became an associate member that same year and a full member in 1977.

In 1978, Gwen took over as editor of 22's monthly newsletter. She made it fun, interesting and made sure every Corral 22 member didn't miss a thing that was happening people wise as well as horse wise each month. The newsletter was so informative that Beverly Collins, the previous editor commented "you have created a monster". Gwen was editor from 1978 until she retired in 2008. During that time the Corral 22 newsletter was a consistent 1st place winner at the ETI National Convention and was beaten only 3 times in all the years of newsletter competition. On those rare occasions it came in second place. Even during her time as ETI President, Gwen continued to do the newsletter for Corral 22.

When Gwen became President of Corral 22, she remained in that office on & off for 22 years until the end of 2007. When not President of 22, she was President of ETI National starting in the mid 1980's. In 1981, Gwen co-chaired her 1st. Death Valley Ride not knowing what she was doing. She ended up chairing that ride for the next 25 years. In 1986 Gwen was voted "Equestrian of The Year" by the Greater Los Angeles Equestrian Association. With all these positions held, she still managed to hold down a full time job. (Continued on page 9)

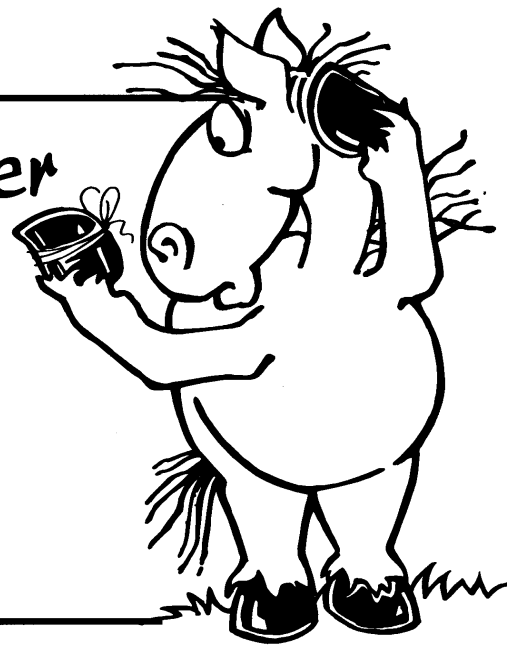

The annual installation party was held at the home of Bob & Jo Boone. Ray Moss had resigned as Area 7 Director and Joe Marinello of Reseda was the new replacement.

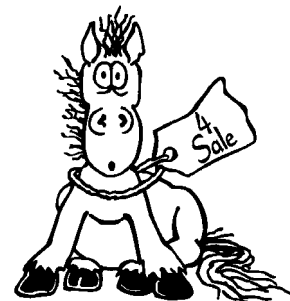
